### **Meet the staff:**

*Mr Wickham joined the staff at Freethorpe at the start of this term. He is currently working with Year 5 and 6 in Purple Class.*

"I grew up and was educated in Great Yarmouth where I excelled in Sport, particularly Football. I achieved my GCSE's at Great Yarmouth High School and "A" Levels at Great Yarmouth College. My ambition was to play professional Football. My parents still live in Great Yarmouth and my sister in West Norfolk.

Aged 18, I left home and attended Brunel University in West London to study a four year B.Ed. Honours Degree in PE & English and qualified with Teacher status in 1993. During my studies, I was fortunate to work for Brentford Football Club as a community coach and play semi-professional Football for Enfield Town, Maidenhead and Egham. I also represented Great Britain Students at Football. In 1993, I had professional trials with Barnet FC but was unsuccessful; I wish my right foot was as good as my left!!

During University, I qualified as an FA coach which enabled me to work for Brentford. I was fortunate again to achieve a coaching position in the USA where I would spend 3 months a year coaching American children aged 5-18. We would stay with a different family each week and were treated like royalty. I was fortunate to work in places like Dallas, Chicago, Long Island and Denver, Colorado. After University, I would return for a month, but to my two favourite destinations: Denver, Colorado and Santa Fe, New Mexico.

My first teaching job was at Greenacre First & Middle School in Great Yarmouth where I was a Y5 teacher and PE Co-ordinator. After two years, I decided to travel again, moving to Blantyre in Malawi, Central Africa, where I completed a VSO role at The Mount View Primary School. This was a fantastic experience, although, not so good when the electricity went down and the rainy season arrived after Christmas. During this voluntary role, I was able to visit Cape Town in South

Returning home in 1997, I was appointed as a PE & English teacher in Essex, I was to spend the next 17 years in South Essex where I would work in several schools. I was Head of PE for 10 years and then promoted to Gifted & Talented Co-ordinator later on. After achieving an Outstanding from our friends, the OFSTED inspectors, I was promoted again to Whole School Teaching & Learning Coach where I was able to help younger teachers with their introduction to working in secondary school.





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In 2015 I returned home to Norfolk and set up home with my partner in Belton, Norfolk. I was fortunate to return to my childhood school at GYHS as an English Teacher. I then was appointed a temporary PE teacher at Wymondham College and Cliff Park Ormiston Academy in Gorleston.

In my spare time I enjoy Go-Karting and golf with my son who is aged 13 and when I can, my partner and I enjoy trips to Manchester where there are some fantastic shopping opportunities and the Theatre of Dreams where my beloved Manchester United play!!

I am excited about my new role at Freethorpe and look forward to working with the students inspiring them to be the best they can be!"

### **Book Week – 29<sup>th</sup> January to 2<sup>nd</sup> February:**

We have a couple of activities that we would like to our families to engage in during the next week.

#### **"Shelfie" display:**

We are going to be having a "Shelfie" display on the board opposite the photocopier. This is an opportunity for children, parents, grandparents to pin up a photograph of their book shelves. We will create a montage display which we can use as a talking point about books with the children but we will also get them to vote for different categories such as: neatest, most creative, tidiest, etc. When you have your photograph you can bring it in to add to the display any day next week. I will make sure there are enough pins on the board ready for all your pictures!

#### **Family homework – reading game competition:**

This week the homework for all children in the school is linked to Book Week. It is an activity for the whole family – your challenge is to make a Reading Game which can be played by primary aged children. It should be exciting and aim to encourage children to engage in reading. How you do this is up to you – time to get creative! If you have more than one child in the school, you only need to produce one game: part of this activity is about working together as a family. The finished games should be brought into school by Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> February. They will then be available for families to play during our open afternoon on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> February. School will be open for parents and family to visit from 2pm on Friday.
