School Council

The School Council met on the 20th November to finalise the arrangements for making decorations for a Christmas tree to display in St Catherine's Church. We have chosen a blue and gold theme to match our school uniform. Each class will be contributing decorations based on this theme. The School Council will be decorating the tree on Thursday the 18th of December, and we hope lots of you will go and visit it.

Governors of All Saints

It has been a busy week for the governors; on Tuesday evening we had an excellent review of the school data for the end of 2014, in a specific GB meeting to assess attainment and progress for all areas of learning for all classes and groups of children across the school. The results are looking extremely pleasing, so thanks to all the staff for their continued hard work.

Our 2014 Early Years data showed that 96% of Acorn Class achieved a good level of development (achieving a 2+ in all areas) compared to the national figure of 60%.

The 2014 Year 1 Phonic Screener check showed that 100% of Class 1 achieved the expected level compared to 74% nationally. The school received a letter from Nick Gibbs, Minister of State for School Reform, in regard to the Phonic Screener in which he stated that:

'The Department for Education wants to ensure every child develops a firm grasp of phonics so I was obviously delighted to see your results. To be in the top 2% of schools with 100% of your pupils achieving the expected standard in the check is a tremendous achievement and points to a high standard of phonics teaching in your school.' The full letter can be found on the school website.

Our 2014 end of Key Stage 1 data showed that the percentage of our children in Year 2 reaching the expected level of 2b or above was 96% in reading; 93% in writing and 96% in maths. This was higher than national results, which were 81% in reading; 70% in writing and 80% in maths.

Our 2014 end of Key Stage 2 data showed that the percentage of our children in Year 6 reaching the expected level of 4b or above was 90% in reading; 94% in writing and 90% in maths. This was higher than national results, which were 78% in reading; 85% in writing and 76% in maths. Along with this 100% of children made expected progress in reading, writing and maths between Key Stage 1 and 2, with 39% of the class in reading, 45% of the class in writing and maths achieving more than expected progress between Key Stage 1 and 2.

Five of our governors spent the morning with Mrs Park on Thursday 26th November conducting a learning walk throughout the school. This enables us to see the many initiatives in practice and allows us to understand the strengths and areas for improvement which are part of the School Development Plan (SDP) first hand in order that the governors can contribute fully to the school's self-evaluation.

I hope to see many of you at our final fundraising evening for this year on Friday 5th December when we will be having a Christmas Chocolate Bingo following the same format as our Easter Chocolate Bingo. Doors open 5.30pm, eyes down at 6.00pm.
