



Message from Governor Services – Parent Governor Ballot –

It is important to set the record straight regarding the recent ballot count. All candidates were invited to attend the count, two did. Two candidates had an equal number of votes in second place. The method used to determine which candidate was successful was via a coin toss, witnessed by both candidates. This is a widely used method of determining the outcome of a tied vote. It is advised by Governors Cymru and, previously by Governors Wales. Perhaps, even **more significantly it follows Electoral Commission advice to Returning Officers for Parliamentary Elections.**

Equality of votes

6.39 When two or more candidates have the same number of votes, you must decide between the candidates by lot.

6.40 Whichever candidate wins the lot is treated as though they had received an additional vote that enables them to be declared elected.

This was not a process dreamed up on the spot, but one following national legislation.

Allegations are also being made about how the coin toss was conducted. While individuals can make and share these allegations, I am not in a position to defend myself at present so that other processes that may be underway are not compromised. However, the toss was made with three other people as well as me, who tossed the coin, in the room. No concern was raised at the time by any individual present as to how the toss was conducted.

My biggest concern is that the accusations being made may call into question the integrity of the school. As Clerk to the GB, I was in charge of the process and involved in all stages. Any questions or allegations should be focussed on me. I will mount a robust defence. Because individuals do not like a process, and request or demand changes, these cannot be made as the process followed was that required by legislation. It should not be taken as an opportunity to knock the school or GB.

May I take this opportunity to apologise to any candidates who heard of the outcome of the ballot through inappropriate sharing of information? Candidates, and office staff, were told that they could inform people whether or not they had been elected, but not the outcome as it related to anyone else. This was to be done by Governors' Support Service. Clearly, some parents were informed of the outcome, and the actual numbers of votes cast through a breach of procedure.
