Put the numbers into the correct order. Now ask the question: What is 1 more than 7? What is 1 more than 12? When this is achieved you could try the question: What is 2 more than 7? When you help with this activity for 2 more only use numbers up to 10. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make an Easter Garden – Include fresh flowers – eggs, chicks and lambs which are signs of new life. • Decorate hard boiled eggs with signs of new life and put them into an Easter basket.

Can you thread the pipe cleaners through the holes? How many can you thread in a minute? • How many beads or buttons can you thread on a lace or string? Can you make a pattern using different colours? • Use small building bricks to make a construction. Can you push the bricks together and then pull them apart? • Can you make a chain of paper clips? Can you make a chain longer than a pencil, a ruler, a book or your table? 	<p>The children in Class One, love to use role-play. Role-play is excellent for Oracy skills and social skills.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Practise buying and selling items in a shop. Use money so that the children can be more confident paying for items and giving change.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use tweezers to see how many pieces of pasta, rice or pom-poms you can pick up. • Use a mini hole punch – how many holes can you make in a piece of paper, card, tissue paper or even leaves? • How quickly can you do up buttons or zips on a jacket or coat? • Pick up dominoes and make a long line next to each other, then knock them down! Use your thumbs and fingers to make a playdough meal! What other foods could you make? • Use finger paints to make a fingerprint picture, painting or collage!
