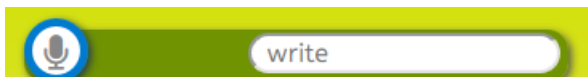

Write

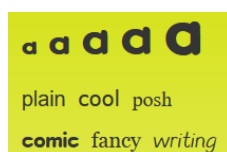
1. To use the write tool click on the green **write** tab at the top of the page.



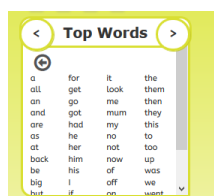
2. Select a template or picture as your background.



3. You can now begin to write on your background. To change the font, size and colour, use the options on the left hand side of the page.



4. You can add a word from a word list to your writing by clicking the arrows underneath the colour options. Scroll through the topics and then click on a word of your choice.



Ideas to be completed in Write.

- Write your name.
- Change the size of the font
- Change the colour of the font
- Write your surname.
- Write a story. Use the word list to help you with any spellings you are unsure of.
- Write a poem.
- Write a shopping list.
- Create a poster.
