Don't forget to include all the cool skills we use in literacy:

- Adverbs (softly, fortunately, slowly, amazingly)
- Adjectives (slippery, crunchy, clear, moss- coloured, bright)
- Verbs (gushing, falling, blowing, shining)
- Sub Clause (As the hot sun peeked out through the tall trees, I could taste the fresh mist of water from the winding waterfall.)
- Capital letters and full stops
- Beautiful handwriting
- Use a thesaurus to find better words
