Challenge: Can you read the directions that you have used to your family? Paint: - Create a repeating pattern snake.</p>
<p>How many different creative ways can you find to write your name? Challenge: Practise writing your surname as well.</p>	<p>On the picture of the snake (Powerpoint) create a repeating pattern snake. Challenge: Can you create a complex pattern snake?</p>	<p>Sound: BBC iPlayer - Maddie do you know song - Sound is all around</p>
<p>Write a description of your favourite jungle animal. Encourage the children to write words or sentences to describe their chosen animal, thinking about colour, size, where they live and the noise that they make.</p>	<p>Cut out the pictures of the jungle animals. Put them into the correct order from shortest to tallest. Pre-reception – 3 pictures Reception – 4 pictures Challenge: 6 pictures</p>	<p>Activity 1: Listen carefully. What sounds can you hear inside or outside? Are the sounds loud or soft sounds? Table is in Powerpoint.</p>
<p>Cut out the pictures of the story. Put the pictures into the correct order. (Please see Powerpoint) Challenge: Can you include adjectives in your sentences when you are retelling the story?</p>	<p>Create your own jungle board game, write the numbers in each space, add your own pictures and use two dice to play it together. Challenge – Write instructions on some of the squares: For example: Miss a go. Jump on 2 spaces.</p>	<p>Science experiment – Can you make the rice dance? (Please see the Powerpoint)</p>
<p>Draw the pictures of the animals which are featured in our story. Now take it in turns with a member of your family to describe the animal. Can your grown -up guess which animal you are describing? Then you listen to the description and see if you can guess which animal is being described.</p>	<p>Look at the pictures of the animals. (pictures on the Powerpoint). Which coins do you need to buy the animals? Challenge: The elephant is for sale for 10 pence. How many different ways can you create the total 10 pence?</p>	<p>Look at the jungle animal Powerpoint and see if you can look through the binoculars and guess which animal you can see.</p>

<p>Hide some jungle animals (toys, photos or pictures that you have drawn). Take your child for a jungle walk and encourage them to find and identify the different animals. They may like to draw or take a photo of the hidden animals that they have found. Challenge: Draw a map and hide the animals. Can your grown up find the animals that you have hidden?</p>	<p>Have a jungle themed picnic! Create a range of snacks based on jungles and jungle animals. Have carrot sticks around some hummus to create a lion themed snack, decorate some biscuits with stripes of black and white to make a zebra themed snack or a snake themed snack by adding cream cheese to celery sticks. NHS Change for life recipes</p>	<p>Make a paper chain snake.</p> 
<p>On your daily walk collect leaves, twigs and branches. Now create your own small world of the jungle in an old tub or container. Draw the characters from the story. Challenge: When the characters meet each other in the small world – which question would they like to ask each other?</p>	<p>Play some movement activity – encourage children to move around a large space creating movements for the different animals in the book.</p>	 <p>Elephant – Create an elephant paper plate puppet.</p>
<p>Draw a map of the jungle. Label your jungle with the animal names. Challenge: Can you write descriptions of the animals.</p>	<p>Game – Make a circle with your family. Pass a soft toy around the circle. When each person is holding the toy it is their turn to speak. Can your child say which jungle animal they would like to be for a day and why?</p>	 <p>Make a monkey handprint.</p>
