Imagine that you had to write a newspaper report about the people (and the snail) who saved the whale. What would it say? Please remember your capital letters/full-stops and finger spaces.</p>	<p>Topic – Money Learn the names and the values of the coins. Pre-reception: Practise counting with pennies (up to a total of 10p) Reception children: BBC Numbertime - Counting and adding money Topmarks - coin game Topmarks - Toyshop money game Cbeebies - coin counting Challenge: Cbeebies - Harder maths quiz</p>	<p>Make a snail garden. You could make your very own snail garden. All you need is a container and some soil. You could then go on a hunt for stones, rotting leaves and twigs. Place them in your snail garden and keep your fingers crossed for snails</p>

Have a go at creating your very own snail or whale using natural materials. How big can you make yours?</p>
<p>BBC Bitesize - 7 Continents All the countries on our planet are located in seven different continents:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Europe 2. Africa 3. North America 4. South America 5. Asia 6. Australasia and Oceania 7. Antarctica <p>Look for the continents on a map or globe. Can you remember the names of the seven continents?</p>	<p>Choose your favourite action song for example – The Grand Old Duke of York. Choose actions to compliment the song.</p> <p>Challenge: Learn a new action song.</p> <p>BBC Action songs</p>	<p>Paint your best grey whales for me, which colours could you use to make grey?</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Create a picture using other materials.</p>
<p>Do you know the names of all the animals you can see in the story? What do you know about their habitats?</p>	<p>Practise counting to 20 by doing 20 jumps, 20 skips, 20 hops, 20 steps. They can do this individually or with family. Counting each one action they do.</p> <p>Challenge: Count to 100</p>	<p><u>Music</u> Can you create your own musical instrument? You can use whatever materials you choose. Maybe make a drum, or a shaker or even a guitar.</p>
