





















Peter Rabbit Growing Your Own Carrots **Answers**




Plant the seeds about 1cm apart.

Cover the seeds with soil.

Water the seeds every few days.



When the leaves have grown a little bit, pick out some of the plants to give the other plants space to grow.



When the leaves are much bigger, the carrots are ready to be picked.





Peter Rabbit Growing Your Own Carrots Instructions

Peter Rabbit is running out of carrots! Read this information about how to grow carrots and then turn them into a set of instructions.

Carrots are easy to grow. Carrot seeds are quite little, so they should be planted in soil about 1cm apart. Once the carrots have been planted, they should be covered with soil. Like all growing things, the seeds need water every few days. Carrots need space to grow, so once the leaves have started to grow, you will need to pick out some of the leaves to give the other ones more space. When the leaves are much bigger, usually between two and three months, the carrots are ready to be picked.
