Some ideas if you would like to use them.

Keep a diary of your holiday. Draw a picture and write some sentences on a daily basis.	Read for ten minutes each day. Talk about the book which you have read.	Reception children: Practise reading and writing your Set 1 and Set 2 sounds.	Learn some nursery rhymes off by heart. This helps to develop memory skills. Have fun by putting actions to the rhyme.
Learn how to read o'clock on a clock.	Practise counting on and back from 0 and then the other numbers up to 20. Pre-reception to 10.	Practise doubles to 10.	Practise using money. Set up a role-play shop at home. Challenge: Can you give change from 10 pence?
Bake together with your family.	Play i-spy on your daily walk.	Learn how to write your numbers 0-9. Challenge: Can you write your numbers to 50 and beyond?	Play a board game. Take turns and follow the rules.
Hold scissors correctly. Can you snip some paper? Can you cut a straight line, a curved line or a wiggly line? Can you cut accurately along a line drawn on the paper.	Can you write your Christian name? Challenge: Write your surname.	Create your own zig-zag books.	Have a jigsaw afternoon.
Play 'Simon says'. Can you be the person who gives the instructions and the the person who follows the instructions? Which role do you like best?	Learn how to throw and catch a ball.	Create a play/show. Challenge: Make some sock puppets.	Look at some old photos and discuss them with your family.
