


Class One - Here is your home learning menu for our topic – The Selfish Crocodile and teeth

<p><b>Book of the week:</b> <b>The Selfish crocodile</b> <b>by Faustin Charles</b></p> <p>When I am teaching my class in School, I read this book to help develop the children’s understanding of oral hygiene.</p>	<p>Reception Children: <a href="#">Practise writing your numbers</a></p> <p>Please remember that Hamilton Maths use links to Youtube. Reception children should not be unsupervised on Youtube.</p> <p><a href="#">Hamilton Trust Maths</a> Pre-Reception children: <a href="#">Practise writing your numbers</a></p>	<p><b>Just2Easy JIT – The Selfish Crocodile folder</b></p> <p><b>Mix:</b> - Design a poster about oral hygiene. <b>Write:</b> - Write the story in your own words. Challenge: You could change the characters in your story. <b>Mix:</b> Read the non-fiction books and answer the questions.</p>
<p>Practise asking questions: You are going to hot seat characters from the story. Hot seating means that you ask questions to one of the characters from the book. For example: you could ask the Selfish Crocodile – Why did you not want any friends in the river? Which questions would you like to ask the characters? Question starters: Why? What? Where? Who? Is? Can? Which? How? Are?</p>	<p>Can you complete the subtraction sums on the Powerpoint? Challenge: Using numbers (from 20 or smaller)</p>	<p>Topic: Teeth</p> <p><a href="#">BBC - How to brush your teeth song</a></p> <p><a href="#">BBC - Wobbly teeth</a></p>
<p>Writing instructions: Look at the pictures which are about brushing your teeth. Cut them out and put them into the correct order. Tell your family how you brush your teeth. Challenge: Write instructions to explain how you brush your teeth.</p>	<p>To help revise time with your child - play the game ‘What’s the time Mr Crocodile?’. This is the same game as ‘What’s the time Mr Wolf?’ Challenge: Once your child is confident with o’clock encourage them to learn half past the hour. <a href="#">Topmarks teaching clock</a></p>	
<p>Oracy activity: Share the story of ‘The Selfish Crocodile’. Talk to your child about the friendship between the animals. Discuss how important it is to be there for our friends and why we should be there for one another.</p>	<p>Learn the days of the week in order. When your child is confident naming the days of the week practise the Months of the year in order. Please see the Powerpoint.</p>	<p>Please listen to the book –Luc the Lion learns why it is important to brush your teeth. it is on the Powerpoint. Name 5 facts that you have learnt from reading this book. Challenge: Create one of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A zig zag book teaching people why they should brush their teeth.</li> <li>• A short video and upload it to JIT.</li> <li>• A piece of art work.</li> </ul>

<p>Talk about planning an expedition through the jungle. Would it be hot or cold? What might we see? This activity could either be completed orally or you could have a backpack full of items such as a water bottle, binoculars, camera, compass, paper and pencil and map. (photos on the Powerpoint) Unpack the backpack and ask the children why they think each item would be useful. Play a circle game of 'In my backpack I will take...'</p>	<p>We need to teach the crocodile how to eat healthy snacks. Design a breakfast, lunch and dinner menu for the crocodile. You could:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• cut pictures out from magazines (with permission)</li> <li>• use toy food,</li> <li>• draw pictures.</li> <li>• create a collage</li> </ul> <p>Challenge: Can you write your menu and describe the food that you have prepared.  <a href="#">NHS Change for life - Healthy recipes</a></p>	<p><b>Crocodile Puppet</b></p>  <p><b>You will need:</b> green card; green paper; 2 lolly sticks; white paper; black pen; glue; sticky tape            Crocodile puppet template if required (see below)  <b>Instructions:</b>            Draw a crocodile head and tail on green card.            Cut out a rectangle of green paper about 10cm by 30cm. Place the paper flat in front of you. Fold over a piece about 1cm wide. Turn the paper over and fold again, forming a concertina. Keep going until all paper is folded. Glue one end of the paper to the head and the other to the tail.            To make the teeth, cut a long triangle from white paper and glue to the face, drawing on a zigzag for the teeth. Cut two circles from white paper for the eyes and glue these to the head, drawing on the pupils. Finally tape a lolly stick to the back of the head and one to the tail.</p>
<p><u>Animal facts</u> – can you find out some interesting information about one of your favourite animals. Ask your grown up to help you to look on the internet or you might have an information book you can look in. Challenge:            Write 2 things about your animal and draw a picture. Can you add some labels? See the example attached – you don't have to make yours on the computer but draw and write instead.</p>	<p>Family games to play:  <b>Jungle Animal Charades</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Like the classic game of charades, this activity requires players to act something out without using any words. Write the names of various jungle animals on notecards, fold them up, and place them in a safari hat. Players will pull an animal name out of the hat and try and get the others to guess the name of the jungle animal using only gestures and motions.</li> <li>• Who can balance on one leg for the longest time?</li> </ul>	<p>Which sounds can you hear? Complete the movements.  <a href="#">BBC ; Listen for the sounds - Jungle</a></p>
