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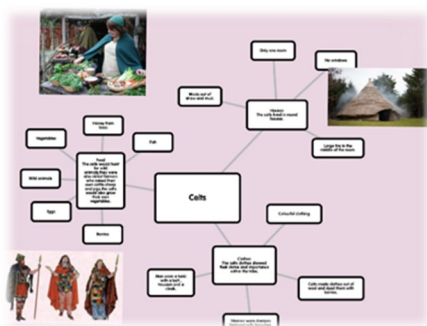
## THE CELTS—YEAR 4

We researched what they wore, where they lived and what they ate.

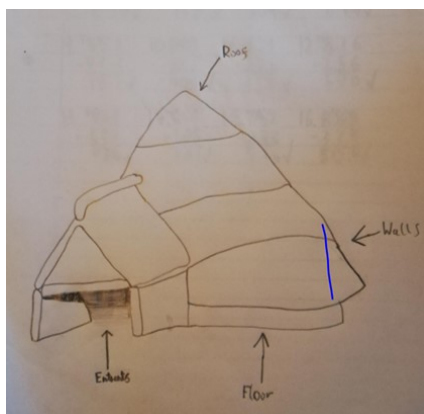
This week we have looked at their homes and compared them to our homes. We found out that their homes were made from straw, mud, wood and animal waste!

- They wash in the rivers and ponds.
- They cooked on the campfire.
- They ate by a campfire on the floor.
- They sat on log benches.
- They got into the houses by walking through a mud door.
- They slept on a dirt floor with animal fur some underneath and some on top.

- We wash in showers and baths.
- We cook on a gas or electric stove or in the oven.
- We eat on a dining table with chairs.
- We sit on very comfortable sofas.
