## **Blue Badge Car Parking Spaces on School Property**

We are experiencing some difficulty managing the limited number of 'disabled' vehicle parking spaces in the school car park despite the recent addition of extra 'disabled' spaces. In order to help us maximise the use of these facilities we would ask all parents and carers to consider the following when dropping off and collecting pupils.

- **If you are not a Blue Badge holder**, please do not park in the 'disabled' parking spaces. 'Disabled' parking spaces are not a convenience; they are reserved for people who have been rigorously assessed and issued with a badge because they need to park close to facilities in order to maintain their mobility and independence.
- **If you are the driver of a Blue Badge holder** who does not need the extra room which a 'disabled' space provides please consider using an ordinary parking space if there is one nearby.
- Do not assume that someone is not entitled to a Blue Badge simply because they appear to be mobile and nimble. On a good day some people are able to walk a greater distance than usual or they may have a hidden impairment which means they need to park close to facilities.
- If you are a Blue Badge holder and are having a good day, please park in an ordinary parking space so that someone who really needs the 'disabled' space on that day can use it.
- Blue badge holders are not allowed to sit in their vehicle while occupying a Blue Badge parking space to wait for people who are not disabled. (Page 3. The Blue Badge Scheme: Rights and Responsibilities in Wales) so please use an ordinary parking space so that someone who really needs to use the 'disabled' space can use it.
- Blue Badge regulations only apply when parking 'on-street', they do not apply in most car parks where separate rules apply. This means that Blue Badge holders are not entitled to park on yellow lines in off-street car parks (Page 7. The Blue Badge Scheme: Rights and Responsibilities in Wales) so please avoid doing this in the interests of safety.
