


# Pen Afan Primary School Ysgol Gynradd Pen Afan Newsletter October 2018

# Reading: PLEASE HELP US TO RAISE STANDARDS IN READING

Reading with your child is vital. Research shows that it's the single most important thing you can do to help your child's education. It's best to read little and often, so try to put aside some time for it **every day**.

Think of ways to make reading fun - you want your child to learn how pleasurable books can be. If you're both enjoying talking about the content of a particular page, linger over it for as long as you like.

Books aren't just about reading the words on the page, they can also present new ideas and topics for you and your child to discuss. Reading with your child makes a <u>huge</u> difference back in school.

With a significant minority, we find ourselves having to deal with issues between pupils in school which have





#### Reminder.....

We are really struggling with attendance at the moment. Please can you ensure that your child is in school on time and as often as is possible?

Lateness = Lost Learning

(Figures below are calculated over a school year)

5 minutes late each day = 3 days lost!

10 minutes late each day = 6 days lost!

15 minutes late each day = 9 days lost!

20 minutes late each day = 12 days lost!

30 minutes late each day = 18 days lost!

98% Attendance = 4 days absent from school
95% Attendance = 10 days absent from school
90% Attendance = 4 weeks absent from school
85% Attendance = 5½ weeks absent from school

# Year 1&2



This term our Topic has been 'Superheroes', which we have really enjoyed. We have discussed what a superhero is in groups and came up with some very interesting reallife superheroes such as - Mums, Dads, Doctors, Police, Paramedics and Firemen. This led on to our visits from the local PCSO's and Armed Police, who we interviewed, and asked all of our questions about what it is like to be a superhero. They were so impressed with us that they allowed us to sit in the police car and even turned the sirens on. We also enjoyed our trip to Maesteg Fire Station. We got to look at all of the equipment and walk around the station to see what it is like to be a fire fighter. I think our favourite part was when the fire fighters let us have a go at squirting the hoses at the fire engine- lots of fun!





In our PE lessons we have been exploring the shapes and movements which superheroes would make. We have worked in groups to devise freeze frames and scenes from our favourite superhero stories.

We have carried out a Science Investigation where we learnt about magnetic and non-magnetic materials. The children were able to free the superheroes from the jar which Dr. Evil had trapped them in by using a magnet to get them out.



In Maths we have been practising our number bonds and learning how to measure using centimetres, decimetres and some of us even metres. We are able to use the words 'less than' and 'more than' to describe a range of objects around the school. We have been ordering coins up to £2 and have been finding correct change.

## Year 3/4 Autumn Term - Potions

The children have settled in well to life in Key Stage 2. It can be a bit of a shock to the system but they are all happy and working hard. They have loved our topic this half term!

## George's Marvellous Medicine

Our class book has been one of the Roald Dahl classics. The children have loved listening to the story and completing lots of activities based on the characters. We wrote descriptions, acted as the characters to answer questions and designed smoothies to cheer Grandma up!

#### Witches and Wizards

The children have worked their socks off using lots of different skills in their topic work. They used their maths skills to design potions based on the number of legs used in the ingredients, they wrote a description in Welsh, wrote recipes and a letter about surgery before the introduction of anaesthetic. The children also made their own potion bottles using clay.

## Solids, Liquids and Gases

Our science work has been based on the features and behaviours of solids, liquids and gases. We looked at their structure, sorted examples and looked at how they can be changed. We also completed a number of investigations; Where in class does an ice cube melt the fastest? Is custand a liquid? and Are all liquids **runny**?
