You can do this by using the template uploaded to Seesaw or by creating your own using pencil and paper/ using an iPad.




The Gruffalo

Times Tables

Prior to current circumstance, we had been doing lots of work on the 5s and 10 times tables and had started looking at the 2s in more detail.

I will also be uploading this 'Splat Square' to Seesaw. The children have used this in class and should be familiar with how to identify the numbers in the times tables.

I will then be uploading some 'Multiplication Mosaics' for Some practise. When we use the 'times' symbol we say that it Means 'lots of'.

Eg.

$$3 \times 5 = 15$$


(3 lots of 5 make 15)

These mosaics also show the divide sign.

When we discuss this symbol we say that it means 'how many' eg.

$$15 \div 5 = 3$$

(How many 5s are in 15?)
