

# Year 2/ 3 Home Learning Tasks Summer Term 2020

Remember to keep practicing your numbers, phonics and reading every day as this will make huge difference. We really don't want you to have forgotten everything you've learnt so far!

### Literacy/Topic task

Our task last week focused on all of the positive things that you could think of about your village. This week, we will be looking at the things that you would like to change about the village.

1. Just as you did last week - begin by creating a mind map of the things that you would like to change.

Some questions to think about:

*Are you happy with the park? Would you like to change it?*

*Are there too many cars parked on the road?*

*What do you think about the pollution coming from the factory?*

*What would be good for the area?*

*Would you like a supermarket nearby?*

*Should there be a large sports facility?*



2. Once you have completed a mind map you can now move on to the next task. You can either create a list of improvements which you would like to make using full sentences OR write a letter to your local council (pretend) explaining what you would like to change about the village.

I have previously uploaded a template for 'letter writing' which you could use to complete this task.


## Numeracy task

## Topic task

Our topic this half term would have been 'Street Detectives'. We would usually focus at looking at the village you live in and talk about all of it's wonderful features.

Look at different examples of a map - what features do you notice? What are the different colours which have been used? What do those colours represent - water/forest/building/road? What symbols have been used - surgery/school/chemist/shop?

### Can you create an aerial map of your village?

- Remember to include all of the main features
- Instead of drawing the buildings/areas in detail, you could draw shapes and label at the side
- You could create this using plain paper and a pencil or if you really want to challenge yourself you could use ICT skills.
