<p>Look at the discussion sheet about a lionfish. It gives you some questions to answer and other mini challenges.</p>	<p>Read the story opening The Lighthouse. Look at the activities on each sheet and have a try. You can use Hwb or paper to complete the activities.</p>	<p>Handwriting We have been working hard to improve our handwriting this year and to start joining some of our letters. Have a go at the poem about plants growing.</p>	<p>Reading comprehension Have a try and see if you can answer the questions about an octopus. Remember, use the text to help you.</p>
<p>We had a look at some 3D shapes last week. This week we are looking at the properties of each shape – the edges, the faces and the vertices (points). Can you find any of these shapes around your house? Send me the photos!</p>	<p>Colour by multiplication Answer the multiplication questions to find which colour you need to fill each section.</p>	<p>Multiplication wheels Can you complete the multiplication wheels? Once they are done ask a grown up to write some questions for you, answer them and then use the multiplication wheels to help you check your answers.</p>	<p>Compass directions Follow the directions and see where you end up. Ask someone to give you directions to another location. Can you write some directions for someone else to follow?</p>
<p>Fossils Can you match the fossils to the correct dinosaur? Which ones do you think were predators and which ones were prey? Why do you think this?</p>	<p>Birds eye view We have done a little bit of work on birds of prey. You need to pretend you are a bird of prey flying above the village. Can you draw a map of what you can see? Have a look at the birds-eye views to help you.</p>	<p>Alligators and crocodiles You need to find out information and watch some clips of both animals. Can you compare them? How are they the same/different? Animal Planet and National Geographic websites will help, along with others. PARENTS – please make sure all clips are suitable!</p>	<p>Nature collage Use resources that you can find in your garden or on your daily walks to create a collage based on our topic. It could be of one predator, a habitat, a food chain, etc.</p>
