SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT ISSUES

During the year, the school has been working on the school development plan activities. The assessments include lesson observation, looking at pupils' work, reviewing policies/schemes of work and looking at the quality of resources within the school.

As part of the Healthy Schools Initiative and the Sustainable Schools we are working towards improving the environment of the school. The School Council is an integral part of the decision-making and this year we have looked at:

SUSTAINABLE SCHOOLS:

Continue to work on themes such as:

- Global Citizenship

In April 2019 the school was awarded an Acorn Award of the Sustainable Schools Gold Award.

HEALTH PROMOTING SCHOOLS:

Continue to work on themes such as:

- Management
- Environment
- Relationships and Feelings

The school continues to work on aspects of the National Qualification Standards.

HEALTHY EATING IN SCHOOLS

Ysgol Gynradd Clydau works hard to promote Healthy Eating. We have completed Phase 5 of the Healthy Schools Project and are committed to promoting good health in our newsletters. Pupils are encouraged to bring water bottles with them to school and water is available for them all day. All pupils in Foundation Phase receive milk daily as part of the Welsh Government scheme. School dinners are cooked off site at Ysgol y Frenni, Crymych through Pembrokeshire Catering who set the menu in accordance with guidance. The meals are low in sugar and salt. Pupils who bring packed lunches are encouraged to eat healthily and advice is given on appropriate provision. We also run a school tuck shop where pupils can buy fruit / toast daily. Pupils may bring fruit from home but no crisps or sweets are allowed at break time. At the end of November Foundation Phase pupils were presented with a Bronze Award for participating in the Design to Smile initiative from Welsh Government to promote children brushing their teeth daily.

Lessons also support healthy living e.g. cooking, gardening to grow our own food, healthy eating in PSE. Fitness is also linked to this through Physical Education lessons.

Toilets

There are sufficient toilet facilities available to all classes. The standard of cleaning is excellent.

BILINGUAL STRATEGY

Ysgol Clydau is categorised as a Welsh medium school, where all aspects of the curriculum in the Foundation Phase are taught through the medium of Welsh and 70% of teaching is taught through the medium of Welsh in KS2. Mathematics and Science are taught through the medium of Welsh.

ADDITIONAL LEARNING NEEDS

Mr Sion Jones (ALNCO) is responsible for Additional Learning Needs. Provision for pupils with special educational needs meet the requirements of statemented and non-statemented pupils. Meetings are held with the classroom teachers and parents to review the children's placement on the special needs register and to discuss the provision and progress of these pupils.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR ADMISSION OF DISABLED PUPILS

The Head teacher will assess special needs requirements regarding the admission of disabled pupils with the Governors well in advance of the anticipated admission, as to facilitate adequate provision. The Disability Equality Plan has been written and approved and is now being implemented.

TARGETS

During the Autumn Term 2018, the Head Teacher and staff discussed target setting for children in the Foundation Phase and KS2 for the period 2018-2019. The targets were agreed with the staff, approved by the LEA and presented to the Governors for their approval and acceptance.

Child Development Assessment Profile for four-year-old children was undertaken at the commencement of each term. Foundation Phase and KS2 Teacher Assessments were administered during the summer term.

At the beginning of May the school administered the Welsh Government tests in Welsh and English, Reading and Numeracy. During the Summer Term the school administered their standardised assessments.

SPORTING AIMS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

We aim to ensure that each child gains pleasure from sport, whatever their capabilities. Through sport they learn self-discipline, tolerance and co-operation. The whole school took advantage of the facilities at Crymych Leisure Centre.

The pupils have taken part in a variety of sporting activities over the year:

- The pupils competed in the Urdd Adrannau Football Competition.
- The pupils took part in the Urdd Sports, 7 a side football tournament and also competed in the swimming gala.
- The pupils took part in a cricket tournament.
- The school held their annual sports day on the school field.

BUILDING

During the Easter Holidays work was carried out to erect new safety gates at the front and at the back of the school. Despite work being carried out during the summer holidays further work is required to solve the dampness problem in the Computer room. New windows were installed in Key Stage 2 classes.

SUPPORT FROM PARENTS AND THE PTA

We are very fortunate in having such an active PTA with good sums of money being raised during the year. These sums are gratefully appreciated and support the school to enrich the curriculum and children's experiences by funding resources and paying for transport to different places. It would be nice to see new faces attending the meetings, as this is an inclusive organisation for all parents and guardians of the school. Therefore please make every effort to attend the next meeting in September. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those parents who have worked hard to raise money for the school during the year.

Here are a few of the events that have taken place during the year:

- The Harvest Thanksgiving was held at Star Chapel. £225 was raised and the money was donated to Amelia Matters Appeal.
- The Christmas concert was held at the school hall. In addition to parents and families, a number of people from the community came along to support the performance.
- In December, pupils and parents went around the neighbourhood singing carols to raise funds for the PTA. This is an event that we hope will continue in the future.
- Many pupils performed in the instrumental concerts in December and July.

PUPIL PARTICIPATION

Pupil participation is an integral part of the pupils' school experience. By giving the pupils a voice they are able to take responsibility for events through the School Council, Eco Club and 'Cyngor Cymreictod'. The pupils are given opportunities to be involved in fundraising, giving them an awareness of others who are in need, and to take part in events in the county.

- £134.15 was raised for Children in Need and £85 for Comic Relief.
- Activities were held to celebrate St David's Day, Fair Trade and Comic Relief days.
- On Wednesday October 3rd, three pupils attended a Welsh Promoting Day at Hermon which was organised by Pembrokeshire County Council with the aim of creating resources to be used at school.

SCHOOL AND EXTERNAL VISITS

Many individuals visit the school throughout the year to enrichen the pupils experience and to give them a wider outlook on many aspects outside the school. The pupils also have opportunities to visit numerous events and locations throughout the year.

• PC Helen Llywelyn, Pembrokeshire Community Police Officer visits the school every term. Also a

representative from the Fire Service has visited the school.

- In October, PCSO Alex Mason visited to teach the importance of taking care during Halloween and Fireworks.
- E-safety awareness sessions the pupils were encouraged to be aware of internet safety.
- At the beginning of November, Natasha from Hedgley Hedgehogs, visited the school to discuss how they care for sick hedgehogs.
- In November, pupils in Key Stage 2 enjoyed a performance of The Blitz by Mewn Cymeriad company. It was an excellent opportunity to re-enact how people felt during the blitz.
- In January, Foundation Phase pupils won an art competition in WCW. Their prize was a book 'Cled y Cwmwl Unig'.
- To celebrate World Book Day the pupils dressed as a character from a book. There was a variety of costumes and thank you to all who assisted with the costumes. In the afternoon pupils in Reception to Year 5 visited the local Library in Crymych.
- In February, four pupils represented the school in a quiz arranged by Menter laith Sir Benfro. Congratulations on achieving fifth place within the County.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Members of the community are welcome to attend concerts and other activities at the school, and we appreciate all the support that the school receives.

- A number of pupils attended the Urdd carol service at Blaenffos chapel.
- Four pupils took part in the Sul yr Urdd Service which took place at Capel Blaenffos on Sunday November 18th.
- In November Key Stage 2 pupils visited Clydau Church. They learnt about the different features of the Church and the work of the Vicar Jonathan Copse.
- There is a strong link between the Cylch Meithrin at Bwlchygroes and Hermon with the school. We
 invite the children to visit the school each year.

SUCCESS WITH THE URDD

As a school we endeavor to support local movements such as the Urdd as we believe it gives the pupils opportunities to take part in a number of activities and to get to know pupils from local schools.

- The school competed in the Urdd cooking competition once again this year.
- All pupils attended the Urdd Jamboree at Crymych or Cilgerran.
- After a successful school eisteddfod, pupils went on to the Area Eisteddfod in Crymych.
- Nine pupils took part in the Urdd Indoor Sports Competition in January with six prizes being won.

APPRECIATION

On behalf of the Governing Body I would like to take this opportunity to thank everybody for their continued support of the school, staff and pupils. Many parents have worked hard to raise money for the school during the year and these contributions are invaluable to help enrich the curriculum and the children's experiences. 



Annex B - Your right to request a meeting with the school's governing body

The Schools Standards and Organisation (Wales) Act 2013 (The Act) removed the requirement for school governing bodies to hold an annual meeting with parents. Instead, new arrangements were introduced to enable parents to request up to 3 meetings in any school year with a governing body, on matters which are of concern to them.

If parents wish to use their rights under the Act to hold a meeting, 4 conditions will need to be satisfied:

1. Parents will need to raise a petition in support of holding a meeting.

The parents of at least ¹10% of the school's registered pupils_will need to sign the petition. If it is a paper petition, then a written signature must be given as well as the name and class of each child who is a registered pupil at the school. If the petition is in electronic format, the 'signature' required is the typed name of the parent plus the name and class of each child who is a registered pupil at the school and the email address of each parent who 'signs' the electronic petition.

²There were 56 children registered as pupils with this school at the beginning of this academic year. Exact roll numbers at any time during the year may be obtained from the school office.

2. The meeting must be called to discuss matters which affect the school

The meeting cannot be called to discuss such matters as the progress of individual pupils, or to make a compliant against a member of the school's staff or governing body.

The petition should contain brief details of the matter(s) to be discussed, and the reasons for calling the meeting. This information should be clearly displayed at the top of the petition, with parents' signatures appearing below.

3. A maximum of 3 meetings can be held during the school year

The law allows parents to use their rights to request up to 3 meetings with a school governing body during the school year.

4. There must be at least 25 school days left in the school year

The law makes it a condition that at least 25 school days are left in the school year when the petition is received so that the meeting can be held.

A "school day" means a day when the school is open to pupils: it does not include weekends, public holidays, school holidays or INSET days.
