



## Learning Activities: Nursery/Reception



**Week Commencing: 20<sup>th</sup> April 2020**

Below are a list of activities for you to complete with your child this week. You can contact me by email or through learning conversations on your child's Hwb account. <b>Literacy</b>	
<b>1</b>	Spelling – make a list of words (3 or 4 letters long) beginning or ending with 's'. You can write the words in interesting ways – different coloured pens, paints, use of chalk outside, in sand etc. <b>Examples – sun, sit, bus, send, sink</b>
<b>2</b>	Writing – Pick a favourite story character and write a sentence about them. Reception pupil may be able to write some of the sentence themselves. Nursery pupils will be able to give you some ideas of words that describe their favourite character and you can support them to write a sentence.
<b>3</b>	Reading – Read 2 of the assigned books on Bug Club, complete the quiz activities (click on the Bug icon throughout the book)

<b>Numeracy</b>	
<b>1</b>	Counting – Collect various items (blocks, pens, lego etc.) and ask your child to count how many there are of each. Work to your child's own level, some pupils are counting up to 5, some to 10 and some to 20 and above. Pupils write down the total number, if able to.
<b>2</b>	Counting – Play a counting game using a computer, tablet or mobile device. Click on the link below to find the activity: <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/teddy-numbers">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/teddy-numbers</a>
<b>3</b>	Number formation – Pupils practise forming their numbers. Some pupils will be able to write the numbers independently. Younger pupils will need you to write the numbers for them and they can go over your handwritten numbers with a felt pen.

<b>Topic – Under the Sea</b>	
<b>1</b>	Read through the story 'Starry Eyed Stan' or any sea-based story. Ask your child to tell you about their favourite part. Pupils can then draw a picture of their favourite character. <b>2</b>	Science – Ask your child to find 10 different objects and ask them whether they think they will sink or float. Test out their predictions in a bowl of water or the bath. Some older children may want to write down what they found out.
