Introduce routines of the setting and new areas of the classroom.

Develop a growing interest in the world around them.

Begin to communicate about what is good and bad, right and wrong, fair and unfair, caring and inconsiderate.

Develop an understanding of how their bodies move and how to move safely with increasing control and coordination.

Understand, appreciate and enjoy the differences between running, walking, skipping and jumping.

Use and handle a range of tools. Developing fine motor skills through

Investigate how places change, e.g. the weather, seasons and festivals using visual and experiential activities.

Identify some animals and plants that live in the outdoor environment. Experiment with different objects and use their senses to sort them into groups according to simple features.

Night and Day (Light and Dark)

Begin to understand that light comes from a variety of sources such as the Sun, and that darkness is the absence of light.

Take part in a variety of science experiments- things that go 'fizz'- magic balloon, lava lamp, volcanoes, bubbles etc.

Language, Literacy and Communication

Enjoy a variety of stories, poems, rhymes and eBooks about ourselves, feelings and topic related stories. These will include 'Inside Out', 'In my heart', 'Room on the Broom', 'Rama and Sita', 'Peace at Last'.

Model correct handling of books and point out features such as title, author etc. Sequence and retell stories.

Participate in role play activities relating to stories e.g. home corner, seasonal role play.

Enjoy opportunities to develop speaking and listening, writing and reading skills in the class continuous and enhanced areas.

Wellcomm- Enjoy opportunities to develop expressive and receptive language skills as well as speaking and listening skills using the Big Book of ideas.

Provide opportunities to develop fine motor skills and letter formation in a variety of multi-sensory ways in the classroom and outdoors.

Writing and reading skills in the class areas and outdoors- Chalking, tracing, shaving foam.

Read, Write Inc- Introduce sounds and rhymes in school.

Cymraeg- Join in with Welsh songs and rhymes. Listen and respond to simple sentences eg Bore da. Tedi Twt stories and weather. Numbers 1-5.

<u>Humanities</u>

Share the celebration of festivals encountering the ways in which people celebrate: Harvest and Christmas. Encourage children to be aware of why these occasions are celebrated in Wales and around the world. Daily Prayers. Develop understanding of different religions and encounter some of the religious beliefs and practises of belivers. Become aware of familiar adults in the school. Sequence events, routines and changes, e.g. in a journey to school, in a story. Learn about distance and how to follow directions and routes within our immediate locality. Use a range of historical sources, including artefacts and photos to show how people celebrated festivals in the past.
