


Dear Parents and Carers,

Mrs White's News ~ This term Year 6 have enjoyed their Design and Technology project where they were researching different types of bridges and locating different bridges around the world. Year 6 News ~ In English, we have been learning all about Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day. We researched the traditions involved such as: the last post, the unnamed soldier and the wearing of poppies. We have begun writing explanation texts about the topic. In maths, we have started our fractions topic. We have found equivalent fractions and learnt how to simplify fractions. We have also learnt how to calculate a fraction of an amount. In Welsh, we have read the poem "Parti" by Aled Richards. We wrote the poem in our books and decorated it with all the food mentioned in the poem. We then

answered questions about the poem. In history, we have been learning all

about Anderson Shelters. We were surprised to hear that Anderson

Nursery News ~ In the Nursery we have been exploring the Hindu festival of Diwali this week and learning about how it is celebrated around the world. We found out that Diwali is the festival of light and that during this festival people light up their homes and have fireworks. We practised our

cutting skills by making our own paper lanterns. We decorated them with bright colours and glitter. We listened to the story of Rama and Sita who are remembered during Diwali. We have enjoyed learning about shapes and identify 2D shapes in a traditional Rangoli pattern. We watched video clips and had lots of singing our 'It's Diwali' song.

A big thank you to Chloe from Road Safety for our virtual session this week. We learnt all about how to cross the road and stay safe.

<u>Year 4 & 5 News</u> \sim In Year 4 & 5 we have been working with fractions in maths. We have focused on equivalent fractions and fractions of quantities recently. We have been learning about




World War Two in history. We have learnt about the Battle of Britain and The Blitz and have written a descriptive text based on a night in an Anderson shelter. We have gone on to learn about evacuees this week. We have thought about precious items we would take in a suitcase if we were evacuated. We have also completed a hot seating task, a pupil took on the role of an evacuee whilst the rest of the class asked them questions. We also took on the role of an evacuee when writing a letter home to our families based on our evacuee experience. We have translated vocabulary relating to evacuees into Welsh, these are our new drilio words. In PE, we took part in a yoga session for National Stress Day, it was



very relaxing. We have been completing silhouette art as part of Remembrance Day. We have also read the World War One poem, In Flanders Fields. We completed various tasks and activities on this poem. We have taken part in a Road Safety session online. We have had a great time celebrating Children in Need today!

Reception & Year 1 News ~ Last week in Reception & Year 1 we have been learning about the story of Guy Fawkes and why we celebrate Bonfire Night. We learned that it was a long time ago and looked at pictures of how people dressed then. We agreed we wouldn't like to dress like that! After learning about the history of Bonfire Night, we talked about



how we celebrate it today. We thought of lots of descriptive words to describe fireworks and the sights, sounds and smells that go with bonfire night. We wrote these words down in our books. We then all discussed the importance of staying safe during bonfire night and we watched a PowerPoint presentation on staying safe and then answered some questions. When we came back to school after celebrating Bonfire Night we shared our experiences of it together and wrote a short recount in our books or told our teacher about it. We also made firework pictures using chalk and finally we wrote a class acrostic poem together.

<u>Miss Randall's News</u> ~ Throughout the week in English we have been looking at writing non-chronological reports. We have linked this to our topic; World War Two. The class have read

and researched information about air raid shelters and the differing types. We have addressed all the features required for a non-chronological report, including writing in first person and distinguishing between facts and opinions. Our final non-chronological report is going to be about 'How to use a gas mask.' In maths, we have been concentrating on finding decimal, percentage and fraction equivalence. Everyone had a good understanding of finding the equivalent of a percentage to a decimal, and vice versa. We are continuing to work on finding the equivalence to a fraction. The class enjoyed finding a percentage of a quantity, by using the given calculation. Times tables will help in these areas. We celebrated the ending of the war with a 2 minute silence on the 11^{th} hour of the 11^{th} day.
