Reading at home

Oxford Owl reading books are now available to read free online! This is the reading scheme we are following in school. [Click the picture to follow the link](#) to find the book your child is on (you will need to register):



When they are ready (when they can read most of the words by sight and/or by sounding them out and can describe what is happening in the story) move them onto the next book! You can also click a button to hear the book being read – your child can try this if they are struggling to read/sound out the words.

Remember, your child is very early on in their reading journey and all children develop at different rates – please don't worry if they can't read the books independently yet!
