


Distance Learning LSC1 Week Beginning 15.6.2020

Make some tickets for the circus. How much will they cost? Practise buying them, how much money will you need to buy more than one?

(Mums and dads, please keep the price below 10p but encourage adding of more than one ticket, use real coins to help if needed so children can move them as they add)

Continue to practice counting. What toys and objects can you find to count?

Creative

If you could perform in the Circus, what act would you like to do? Would you need any special skills for your act, such as the ability to juggle, weight lift or balance? Pretend you're in the circus and show me your act (carefully!)

A mermaid is half human with a fish's tail. Can you create a creature that is a mixture of two or more animals?

Can you create a picture of the singing mermaid using collage?



Physical/Outdoors

Plan/create a performance for the acrobats at the circus. Move in different ways such as rolling, jumping, leaping. Can you make your body twist and twirl? See if you can make up a short sequence that you can remember and practise so I can see it.

Keep moving and exercising, maybe you could try a new sport or activity this week.

Lego/building challenge

Can you build a circus tent? What materials would you need to use?

Or build something you would find at the seaside.
