


## Distance Learning LSC1 Week Beginning 15.6.2020

### Phonics/Literacy

You could write some acts of kindness on individual pieces of paper and put them in a jar then pick one each day and try to complete it.

Have a look around for items which are shiny like the rainbow fish. Can you see your reflection? What did you find?
