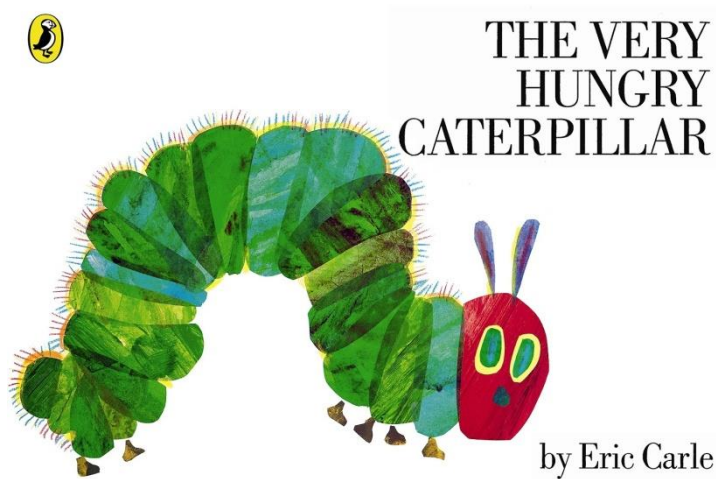

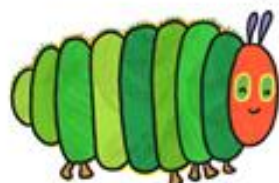
Our new books are all about caterpillars and butterflies! We are starting with 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle. Read the story together and then try the story activities below – click on the picture to access the story online:



wc 15 June Story Activities:

- Read and talk about the story together.
- Look at some of the words together and practise saying them out loud whilst pointing to the word.
- Encourage your child to retell the story themselves.
- Talk about their favourite part of the story.
- What if something different happened at the end?
- Can you remember all the different food the Hungry Caterpillar ate? Which day did he eat each food?

The Very Hungry Caterpillar is very full! Can you remember the names of the food he ate?

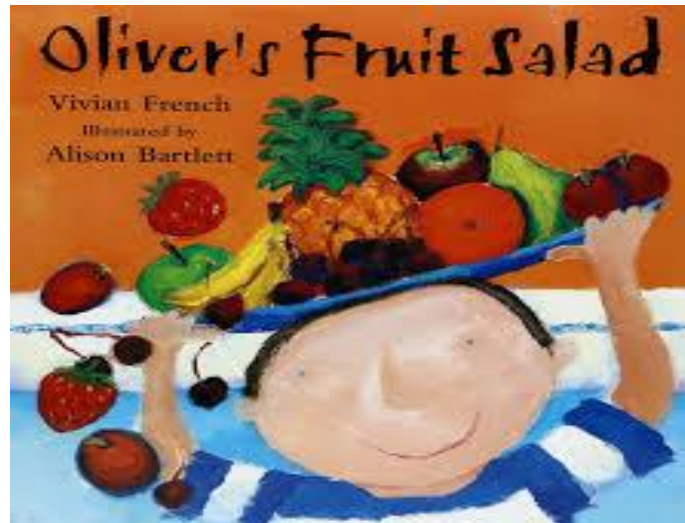
- Story Scribing - can you write a letter to the caterpillar and say what you like to eat?
Mums and Dads: *please write the words down for your child as they say them. This is called story scribing and we do it in school a lot. Please write down the words exactly as your child says them to you and read the sentences back to them here and there to check they are happy with what you are writing. At the end, read the whole letter out. If they want to take the pencil from you and “write” some of the words themselves, that is great too!*
- Can you draw a butterfly, a caterpillar or the different food from the story?
- Can you make a food diary of what food you eat for breakfast or dinner? Mums and dads, please write the food names down for your child.

- Here are the key words from the story. Have a go at saying some!

- Read and talk about the story together.

- What if something different happened at the end?
- Have you ever tried growing your own fruit?
- **Describing Fruit** - What is your favourite type of fruit? Why do you like it so much? Fruit is really healthy for our body. Can you choose a fruit and describe it to your grown up? Maybe you can draw the fruit?
- Continue to practise counting in Welsh.
