Dear Parent, Carer or Guardian,

Over the Easter Break please follow the guidance set out by Welsh Government. This is vital in the recovery and in us staying out of further lockdowns. Please continue to follow the guidance given which is that Wales is still at Level 4 alert.

You must:

- Stay Local
- Work from home if you can
- Wear a face covering where required
- Wash your hands regularly
- Stay 2 meters from anyone you do not live with.

You must self-isolate if you or anyone in your household has symptoms.

As a precaution if your child has any of these new symptoms, they should get a test.

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature: this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough: this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste: this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

PDG Access Grant

Don't forget to apply for the PDG Access grant for pupils who are eligible for free school meals entering Reception, Year 1, Year 3 and Year 5 classes of maintained Primary Schools in September 2020. It can help with the purchase of school uniform including coats and shoes, school sports kit including footwear, uniform for enrichment activities, including but not limited to, scouts; guides; cadets; martial arts; sports; performing arts or dance. It can also be used for equipment e.g. school bags and stationery, equipment for out of school hour's trips such as outdoor learning e.g. waterproofs and also, the criteria has been extended to include laptops or tablets. School Garden Area



This is being transformed into an area which will support Forest schools activates. The aim is for each staff member at school to be trained to level 2 in Forest schools. There will be others trained up higher as is needed. We have had discussions with various people both internally within NPT and external companies. We have had plans drawn up. (Shown above). This is not the final draft but I felt compelled to share with you our vision for this area. In here there will be a fire pit, log storage hut, planters and various



other things. I hope this work will start in the very near future.

The School Allotment Area: (School Playing Field) The aim here is to transform part of the school into becoming an



area where pupils will be given opportunities to research, plant and grow various fruit and vegetables. Each class will be responsible for preparing, growing and producing vegetables or fruit which will then be sold to our families and/or the local community via our Farm Shop. Pupils will be responsible for the organisation of the shop and we hope to work with local businesses to stock their produce at the shop. For example Bee1 and Morrison's and Tesco to name a few. This is still in development stage and this is by no means a done deal. However, I firmly believe that this area will be fundamental; in the restore, repair and reengagement needed for our families, community and more importantly our pupils. With the isolation that we have felt over the past year and with the

need to start growing our own vegetables due to Brexit, I feel this is an opportunity to give something back to our community. Imagine the children using their own produce, creating a soup and serving it for a small fee to people within our community who could sit and enjoy a nourishing soup whilst socially reconnecting with each other as well as having some fresh air. The produce sold will be at a nominal fee and will allow families to buy healthy local produce.
