Language, Literacy and Communication	Oracy: Pie Corbett - oral story Telling & Story Maps, Questioning, Visualisation, P4C Reading: Read, Write Inc Speed Sound Sets 1, 2 and 3, Oxford Reading Tree words, 8 Reading Behaviours, Index, Contents & Glossary of non-fiction books Writing: Letter formation, Introduction to cursive writing, Daily Edit (use of full stops, Capital Letters & Question Marks), Instructional writing, Report writing, Pie Corbett-story maps (imitation & innovation).			
Mathematical Development	Number and place Value – estimating, counting, reading, writing, comparing and ordering numbers to 30; Mental Addition and Subtraction – 1 more, 1 less, number bonds to 5, 6, 7 & 10, counting on and counting back; Mental Multiplication and Division – double numbers to 20; Geometry – Recognise, name, describe & sort 2D shapes; Statistics – Venn diagrams & Carroll diagrams; Measurement – compare lengths & heights, estimate, compare & measure lengths using non-standard units, recognise coins & know values up to £2; Problem Solving – find missing numbers and number sentences, use number facts to solve problems.			
Knowledge and Understanding of the World	Properties of materials and their uses. Investigations to explore different materials. Castles and houses long ago – visit to St Fagans. ICT: Change the font style, colour and size using Hwb. Collect and present data in pictograms and develop creative skills using Hwb. Use a variety of Learning Apps on the iPads. Green Screen news report.			
Welsh Development	Oral: (Incidental): Daily greetings, registration, numbers and counting, commands; Oral (Conversational): Asking and answering questions about ourselves, the weather and colours, expressing needs; Reading and Writing: Introducing simple Welsh sentences into Daily Edit, various Tedi Twt stories introducing sentence patterns: "Sut wyt ti? Sut mae'r tywydd heddiw? Beth wyt ti hoffi? Ga i?"			
Creative Development	Create Art work based in the style of Welsh artist Martyn Evans focus on colour, shape and pattern. X L Wales - building castles using K'nex. Music - composition based on the story of the Two Dragons. Hairy Scary castle composition.			
Physical Development	Write Dance – large gross motor movements to music to help develop fine motor skills; Gymnastic lessons – travelling in different ways using mats, hoops and benches; Fine motor skills–cutting/sticking, pencil control, threading etc; Woodlands – activities enhancing physical development & coordination			
PSE	Check in circle, Class Charter, School values, playing co-operatively, taking turns, self- help skills, healthy eating, care and consideration for others and the environment.
