Activity:

R.E. MONDAY

Last Tuesday was Shrove Tuesday or Pancake Day. Shrove Tuesday is a Christian festival and is the day before Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. Lent is traditionally a time of fasting, and often Christians give things up - such as chocolate. Eating pancakes on Shrove Tuesday comes from families using up all ingredients in their cupboards so that they can start Lent the next day.

I'd like you to write down a simple set of instructions/recipe on how to make pancakes.

Try to write your set of instructions in your own words:

- Write a heading and underline it.
- Write a short introduction explaining pancakes and Shrove Tuesday.
- Write a sub-heading ('Ingredients' or 'What you need') and underline it.
- Write a list of ingredients that you will need for the recipe.
- Write another sub-heading ('Method' or 'What to do') and underline it.
- Start writing your instructions down the page. Remember to number each one. Try to start each instruction with a bossy verb, e.g. Put, Stir, Mix, Pour, Heat.
- Read over your work to check it makes sense.

Record a pancake video for Flipgrid. You could show us your set of instructions, mixing the ingredients, cooking a pancake, flipping a pancake or eating a finished pancake with your choice of topping.
