We are a Rights Respecting School

Article 2 - All children have rights

Article 6 - All children have the right to life and to be healthy

Article 12 - All children have the right to be heard

Article 19 - All children have the right to be safe

Article 24 - All children have the right to food, water and medical care

Article 27 - All children have the right to a good standard of living

Article 29—All children have the right to be the best they can be

Article 31 - All children have the right to relax and play



Sometimes children are hurt by other children or grown ups and it makes them feel really bad.

They might feel:

- Worried
- Upset
- Scared
- Lonely
- Nervous



We want to make sure that you are happy and safe. This is **very** important to us. All the people that work at our school like looking after you. We must try to notice if you are being treated badly or unfairly. We must listen to you if you try to talk to us about a problem. Sometimes we might need help so that we can help you.

It is very important that you know how to look after yourselves

All the people that work here have rules to follow.

One of our rules is to protect and look after you carefully. This is called Child Protection and there is lots of information about this in the office. Anybody can have a look at it to read if they want to.

If you want to talk to someone because you are upset or you have a problem or you have a question, you can talk to anyone you trust.

Think of some people you could talk to. At school you can talk to anyone.
