Language, Literacy and Communication

- Play the 'hot and cold' game (hide a sound written on paper in a room, when the child gets close to where the sound is hidden say 'hot' if they move away from where the sound is hidden say 'cold', continue until the letter sound is found) with the letter sounds s,a,t,p,i,n,c,k,e plus three new letter sounds - h,r,m. Spread the letter sounds out over the week, you don't have to do them all at once.

Mathematics

- How many shapes do you know? Go on a shape hunt around your house and garden, how many can you find? Have a go at drawing simple shapes - circle, triangle, square, rectangle.

Science and Technology

- Find out about the life cycle of a butterfly. Read the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle. Look at pictures of butterflies, talk about their wings, the shapes, patterns and colours you can see. Discuss how they are the same on both sides - symmetrical.

Humanities

- What type of house do you live in? Find out about different types of homes - terraced, semi-detached, detached, flat, bungalow, caravan etc. See if you can spot the different types of houses on your daily walk.

Expressive Arts

- Paint a symmetrical picture of a butterfly. Fold a piece of paper in half, open it up, paint on one side of the paper, fold it back over again and press down onto the painted side, smooth towards the edge of the paper slowly. Open up the folded paper to reveal a symmetrical butterfly. Cut it out in the shape of butterfly wings and display on the wall!

Health and Wellbeing

- Find out about the fruits that butterflies like to eat. With the help of a grown up make a feast fit for a butterfly. Dress up as a beautiful butterfly (wear brightly coloured clothes, or paint a butterfly on your face) eat your fruit feast outside in the sunshine. Have fun!!
