COVID Update—Policies and Procedures

After the success of the first few weeks and by continuously evaluating our 'new normal' procedures through discussions with parents, pupils, staff and Governors we are now in a place to amend and relax some of our routines.

These amendments have been made with the safety of all of our pupils and staff but may be revoked if needed. Therefore from ...

Monday 21st September—

⇒ Breakfast club resumes. (Please see below.) Also from...

Monday 28th September—

- ⇒ Slight alterations to entry and exit times (please see overleaf).
- ⇒ Year 6 will begin to use their individual lockers. However, pupils should only bring to the school their waterproof winter coat and lunch box.
- ⇒ Year 2 will begin to use their cloakroom. However, pupils should only bring to the school their waterproof winter coat and lunch box.
- ⇒ Year 1 to 6 class bubbles will socially distance and begin to eat their lunch in the hall. Hopefully, this system will allow us to return to warm school cooked lunches. Our staggered lunch times and play times will remain,

Free School Meals

Online payment for families in receipt of free school meals has now ended. The school will provide a free daily lunch for all eligible children. If you would like to discuss this please contact the school office.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast club will resume for all pupils from Monday 21st September. Pupils are to enter through the usual gate (single red gate) and door (Year 1/2) between 8.10am and 8.30am. A staff member will meet and greet your children with all adults asked to remain outside of the school perimeter. During breakfast club all pupils will be sat within their class bubbles or with siblings.

Fit in 15

In addition to morning and lunch play time all of our pupils will complete a daily Fit in 15 session. Hopefully our pupils will be able to complete a daily mile within this fifteen minutes. Why not ask them how many laps of the top yard they managed?

With neighbouring authorities, local schools and an increasing infection rate it is becoming apparent that we may need to continue our new procedures for some time. Therefore, we have altered some entry and exit times to:

- ⇒ ensure that all pupils receive their allocated teaching times,
- ⇒ reduce the time that the pupils are waiting on their red dots,
- ⇒ minimise the time that parents/carers have to wait between drop off and pick up.

These new times will begin the week beginning **Monday 28th September**.

Keep Wales Safe - protect yourself, others and the NHS from a second wave

Wash hands regularly

especially if you've been shopping, picked up a package or are about to handle food



Keep social distancing

stay a safe distance away from people who aren't in your extended household



Wear a face covering

where required or in enclosed spaces where social distancing is difficult



Test, Trace, Protect to avoid a second wave

The Health Board and Councils run the Covid-19 testing and contact tracing service.

1 Test If you have Covid-19 symptoms (new, persistent cough, loss of taste or smell, high temperature), visit www.sbuhb.nhs.wales and follow the Covid-19 link to get a test. Or, call 01639 862757 (9am - 8pm) to book a test, or freephone 119 for a home testing kit. People with hearing or speech difficulties can call 18001 119.

2 Trace If you test positive you will get a phone call from our contact tracing team.

3 Protect If our contact tracers get in touch follow their advice to keep Wales safe.

Be Scam aware -

a contact tracer will
never ask you to:

- Dial a premium rate number
- Make any form of payment
- Provide bank account details
- Give passwords or PINs
- Disclose personal/medical info
- Download any software
