Challenges for May 4th to May 8th

What is V.E. Day?

V.E. Day = Victory in Europe Day

It first took place on May 8th 1945.

VE Day marked the formal conclusion of the war with Germany and brought to an end six years of suffering, courage and endurance across the world.

People ran out on to the streets, hanging bunting and banners and dancing. Everyone brought out food to share at street parties.
