### Home Learning Choice Menu – History of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century and Earth & Space

<p><b><u>Literacy (Oracy)</u></b></p> <p>Create a 5-minute presentation to present to the class on <b><i>a topic of your choice</i></b>. How you choose to present is entirely up to you. Do NOT read from a script.</p> <p><b><u><i>Your presentation MUST be ready by Monday 1<sup>st</sup> November (giving you half term to fully rehearse).</i></u></b></p>	<p><b><u>Humanities</u></b></p> <p>Write a newspaper report about any important event from the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. Think about what happened, when and why it was historically significant. Set out your news report like a newspaper front page, include a newspaper name, a clever headline, write in columns, use the words of eye-witnesses &amp; add a picture.</p>
<p><b><u>Expressive Art</u></b></p> <p>Copy or create a picture of a scene from any decade of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. You can use any medium you choose (pencils, felt-tips, paint, ICT etc). The scene needs to be iconic and instantly recognisable... so choose wisely &amp; work carefully to the best of your ability (don't rush your work).</p>	<p><b><u>Expressive Art</u></b></p> <p>Design and make a space themed 3D model of your choice. This can be made out any materials you can find and can be of anything you choose. It could be a rocket, a planet or a space scene. Anything you choose to make I am sure will be out of this world!</p>
<p><b><u>Science &amp; Technology</u></b></p> <p>Research and create a factsheet on any planet of your choice. Include as many interesting facts as you can discover. Present your research with images on one page- this can be done using ICT and uploaded to the Google Classroom.</p>	<p><b><u>Numeracy</u></b></p> <p>Create a poster displaying number related facts about any events from the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. Present your page in a bright &amp; attractive manner. Include facts such as; <b><i>600,000,000 people watched the moon landing in 1969.</i></b> Or, <b><i>The Titanic cost \$7,500,000 to build in 1912.</i></b></p>

Please remember there is **ALWAYS** weekly spellings and tables tests to practice. Reading should also be done as often as possible & listening to your own child read is not only enjoyable, but it is also proven to be very beneficial. My Maths and TT Rockstars are also great additional 'at home' resources to help your child with their numeracy skills and boost confidence with their in-class maths.
