<p>Winnie's Winter Warmers</p>	<p>The World's Best Hot Chocolate</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • First, put $\frac{3}{4}$ of a cup of water into a small, metal pan and bring it to the boil. • Next, whisk three tablespoons of finely milled cocoa powder into the pan. • After that, mix in the following ingredients: chocolate chips, sugar and whole milk. • Pour the mixture into mugs, top with whipped cream and add marshmallows. <p>Warming Winter Broth</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Boil some ham in a sturdy, metal pot overnight. • For the soup, peel and chop an onion, some garlic, a potato and two parsnips. • Heat a glug of oil in your pan and lightly cook the ham and the vegetables together. • Add water and boil for around 30 minutes. • Serve with warm, crusty bread. <p>What a delicious broth you have made!</p>
