Our Early Years classroom

Welcome to Early Years!

Our classroom environment is set up to allow lots of different kinds of learning to happen in many different contexts. All of the areas of learning identified in the Early Years Foundation Stage profile are catered for, with many more besides! There are aspects of the environment that remain largely the same, for example the mud kitchen, the sand pit and the role play shed will usually be used as part of our daily learning. They are adapted regularly to engage and interest the children, extend their thinking or develop new ideas. There will always be opportunities to read, write and learn about maths outside as well as inside the classroom.

Each term we have a series of themes or topics. These are broadly based around the topics in key stage one as it is important for EYFS to feel part of the wider school. However there are also times when our topics adapt to follow the interests and needs of the children in the class. Every topic includes aspects of all areas of learning. Here is an idea of the topics we plan to use this term; this is not exhaustive and is subject to change as we get to know your children better!

Phonics and reading

Learning to recognise letter sounds, 3 new sounds each week.

Learning to blend sounds together to make words c-a-t.....cat.

Beginning to read simple sentences.

Practising writing my name.

Using our skills in a variety of contexts around our Early Years environment.

Working with an adult to read and write for different purposes.

Counting and numbers

Counting objects up to ten and beyond.

Recognising the numerals up to ten.

Ordering numbers and objects.

Writing numerals with the correct movements and the right way round.

Measuring lots of different things in lots of different ways.

Problem solving and applying our skills in a range of different contexts around our early years class-room.

Good to know....
