## **English**

This term we will be reading and analysing a range of fiction, non-fiction and poetry linked to our 'Chocolate' topic. The children will be using them to plan, compose and edit their own writing. This will include recipes, adverts and stories set in imaginary worlds. We will also be reading and performing poems in preparation for the Poetry Speech Festival. The children will work on developing their understanding of the grammatical structure of sentences and focus on increasing the range of punctuation they apply in their writing, including speech marks,

Year 3 & 4 **Spring Term** 

### **Year 3 Maths**

We will continue to work on the place value of each digit in a 3-digit number up to 1000. We will further develop efficient mental methods for addition and subtraction and learn how to record our workings out using formal written methods. We will continue to learn and practice the 3, 4 and 8 times tables in order to apply them in problem-solving. We will also focus this term on fractions. We will learn how to recognise and count up and down in tenths, learn how to recognise, find and write fractions of a set of objects, as well as recognise and use fractions as numbers. We will add and subtract fractions with the same denominator and compare and order unit fractions.

## Music

We will compose and perform jingles for marketing our own chocolate bars using our voices and a range of percussion. Year 3 will continue their music lessons with Mr Draycott

# Computing

We will review the different ways children can ensure they are safe when they are online and how they can report any concerns. We will learn how to use search technologies effectively in order to select relevant information about our topic. We will then learn how to present this

# **Narrative**

# Geography/History

We will learn about the history of chocolate and find out where chocolate comes from and how it is made. We will learn about the journey from 'Bean to Bar'. We will find out who first made chocolate. discover where cocoa beans are grown and why specific climates are required. We will be using maps, atlases, globes and digital and computer mapping to locate these countries and describe their physical features. We will be communicating our understanding in different ways including maps and IT.

#### Science

This term our focus in Science is 'States of Matter'. We will be using a range of practical experiments to explore solids, liquids and gases. The children will be developing their questioning skills and applying their scientific knowledge in different contexts. There will be opportunities for the children to explore the processes of heating and cooling, make careful observations during different experiments and record their results in tables

#### Art and DT

We will be learning about Impressionism and the life and work of the great French artist Claude Monet, focusing on painting techniques for landscapes.
