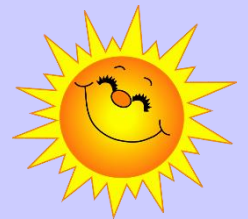

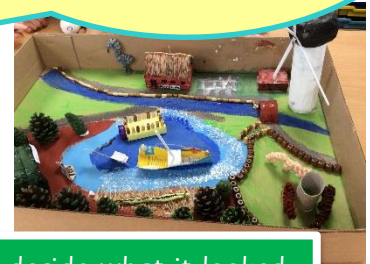
"I enjoyed creating the 'Broads in a Box' because everyone participated and it was nice to see everyone happy. My favourite part was painting the habitats." - Logan
