On Monday Year 3 and 4 had a special prehistoric workshop led by Roots. Jess and Kally provided a range of outdoor learning experiences which helped us to understand even more how Prehistoric people lived. We pretended to travel back in time and engaged in a range of practical experiences. We used clay to make jewellery, we made our own axes, we made paint from paprika, turmeric, chalk and charcoal to paint the trees in our woods. In the afternoon, we had a fire circle and had a go at creating sparks in groups, before sampling some Stone Age inspired food. We had rainbow trout, sweet potato and beans. We had an absolutely brilliant time. The children loved learning outside and experiencing things they would not have been able to at home or in the classroom. #### Free School Meals / Pupil Premium

If you receive certain benefits, the school can receive extra money. This is called Pupil Premium, and amounts to £1345 per year per pupil (in any year group). It would also entitle your child to Free School Meals, if they are in Year 3 and above.

If you are receiving any benefits please click on the link <u>here</u> to check to see whether you are able to apply, an if so please do complete an application. Your child does not have to have the FSM in school if they do not wish to, but if you apply, this money can be used to support children's learning in school. This is particularly important money for us in the current circumstances when budgets are so tight. Thank you.
