Working with you as parents and carers to keep you informed on your child's progress is an important part of school life. The pandemic has made things more challenging in this area, but we think that it's important that you know how your child has settled back into school and how well they are doing with their learning. This week you will have a letter from your child's class teacher (from Nursery 2 to Year 6) inviting you to take part in a 'virtual parents' evening' through Microsoft Teams. There will be a help guide with the letter. Please read the letter, provide the email address you wish to use on the form and install the Teams app on your device.

This week is National Outdoor Learning week and all of our classes will be taking part in learning activities outside of the classroom. Outdoor learning is good for the children's wellbeing as well as helping to develop skills in a different way. I hope that the children enjoy taking part.

In the newsletters each fortnight I will be sharing our Welsh pattern that the children are using in and around the school. It would be great if you could ask the children the questions at home. If you're not sure how to say it, you can type the sentence into the Google Translate app and it will read it back to you. This week, the pattern is 'Wyt ti'n iawn?' which means 'are you ok?'. You can answer by saying 'Ydw, dw i'n iawn, diolch' which means 'Yes, I'm ok, thanks'.

As part of our preparation for the new curriculum, we have taken the views that parents have shared with us when looking at what you felt we needed more of or less of in our curriculum and reviewed our school vision statement. This vision statement included contributions from school staff, the children and our Governing Body. Our vision for the school statement is now "We have high expectations that encourage good habits, promote ambition and positive attitudes to learning. This will enable the children to grow to be literate, numerate, digitally competent and independent life-long learners. They will be happy, healthy, safe and contribute creatively and ethically to their community, Wales and the world." I think you'd agree that these are important priorities for our school and for our pupils.
