I hope that the children enjoyed their Outdoor Learning Week activities. They certainly had the weather to make the most of it! Next week, school will be closed on Monday 3rd of May for the May Day Bank Holiday. School will open, as usual, on Tuesday 4th of May. Hopefully the fine weather will remain with us for everyone to enjoy. As the sun is getting stronger during this time of year, can you please apply sun cream to your child on the sunnier days and consider providing a sun hat.

There will be a change to the school lunch menu for next week from the published menu. On Tuesday it will now be pizza, potato smiles and beans. Wednesday will be curry day and Thursday will be a sausage dinner. Friday of next week will be fish fingers and chips.

This fortnight, the Welsh language pattern we're using in school is 'Oes ___ gyda ti?' which means 'Have you got a ___?'. You can answer by saying 'Oes, mae ___ gyda fi' which means 'Yes, I've got a ___' or 'Nac oes, does dim ___ gyda fi'. Remember, if you're not sure how to say it, you can type the sentence into the Google Translate app or you can watch the video of the newsletter where I'll (try to!) show you how.

Please don't forget to return your report slips to the school for parents evening meetings. If you're not able to make the day or time given due to work or other reasons that can not be changed, we may be able to contact you a different time to catch up on how your child has settled back into school and to give you a progress update.

We are going to be having two INSET days in the last week of the Summer Term. They will be held on Wednesday 14th and Thursday 15th of July. In that last week, the children will be going to their new classes with their new teachers on the Monday and Tuesday. The Wednesday and Thursday will be used for staff training and to give 48 hours between the areas being used by different classes. This helps us to make sure that the children get to go to their new classes and meet their new teachers, but also reduce any COVID related risks. Year 6 will be together in school. The children will then be back with their usual teacher in their usual classroom for the last day of term on Friday the 16th of July.
