The pilot project for Year 5 and Year 6 on extending the school day has now been pushed back to start in the week beginning Monday 28<sup>th</sup> of February. We hope that by moving the date back, there is less chance of disruption from Covid and that we will be in lower tiers of restrictions meaning more providers are available to provide sessions.
