Parent Meetings

Your right to request a meeting with the school's governing body

The Schools Standards and Organisation (Wales) Act 2013 (The Act) removed the requirement for school governing bodies to hold an annual meeting with parents. Instead, new arrangements were introduced to enable parents to request up to 3 meetings in any school year with a governing body, on matters which are of concern to them.

If parents wish to use their rights under the Act to hold a meeting, 4 conditions will need to be satisfied:

1. Parents will need to raise a petition in support of holding a meeting.

The parents of at least 10% of the school's registered pupils will need to sign the petition. If it is a paper petition, then a written signature must be given as well as the name and class of each child who is a registered pupil at the school. If the petition is in electronic format, the 'signature' required is the typed name of the parent plus the name and class of each child who is a registered pupil at the school and the email address of each parent who 'signs' the electronic petition.

There were 19 children registered as pupils with this school at the beginning of this academic year. Exact roll numbers at any time during the year may be obtained from the school office.

2. The meeting must be called to discuss matters which affect the school

The meeting cannot be called to discuss such matters as the progress of individual pupils, or to make a complaint against a member of the school's staff or governing body.

The petition should contain brief details of the matter(s) to be discussed, and the reasons for calling the meeting. This information should be clearly displayed at the top of the petition, with parents' signatures appearing below.

3. A maximum of 3 meetings can be held during the school year

The law allows parents to use their rights to request up to 3 meetings with a school governing body during the school year.

4. There must be at least 25 school days left in the school year

The law makes it a condition that at least 25 school days are left in the school year when the petition is received so that the meeting can be held.

A "school day" means a day when the school is open to pupils: it does not include weekends, public holidays, school holidays or INSET days.

Curriculum and organisation of education and teaching methods

The school is a full primary school and takes pupils the term after their 3rd birthday.

There are 2 Foundation Phase Classes. Class One; Nursery & Reception, Class Two; Years 1 and 2 There are 2 Key Stage 2 classes. Class Three: Years 3 & 4, Class Four; Years 5 & 6

The school follows the appropriate guidelines as set out by the Welsh Assembly for the Foundation Phase and Curriculum 2008.

The school uses a range of teaching styles and methods to match the needs of the children within the school. The curriculum is adapted and modified to meet the needs of the children where necessary.

School language category

The school is an English Medium school

Welsh is taught throughout the school as a second language. The use of incidental Welsh to promote bilingualism is actively promoted. In addition to Welsh 2nd language lessons every effort is used to deliver some lessons bilingually, depending upon the context of the lesson. Each week there is a specific assembly in Welsh.

Information is shared with the secondary school on the end of key stage 2 assessments for Welsh 2nd Language and the school takes part in moderation activities with Ysgol Harri Tudr.

School Toilets; Part time Nursery children have their own unisex toilets. Class One and Class two share a unisex toilet block. Class Three and Class Four share a unisex toilet block.

There is one disabled toilet/wet room for pupil use.

There is in addition a disabled toilet in the reception area as well as two staff toilets in the staff side of the building

All toilets are cleaned on a regular basis to a good standard.

Information about the action taken to promote healthy eating and drinking

The school is a health promoting school. As part of our class work children are taught the benefits of a healthy diet and of the importance of exercise.

The school operates a fruit only policy for breaktime and parents are positively encouraged to only send fruit to school as snacks for pupils. We also encourage parents to send healthy packed lunches to school.
