### Letter from the Director of Education to all Parents and Carers of children who attend Pembrokeshire Schools

Dear Parents / Carers,

As you will be aware, numbers of Coronavirus cases are increasing rapidly across Wales, including in Pembrokeshire.

Following advice received by the Chief Medical Officer secondary schools have been directed by the Minister to move to distance learning activities from Monday 14<sup>th</sup> December onwards. This means that the last day on site for secondary school learners will be Friday 11<sup>th</sup> December.

The advice of the Chief Medical Officer is also that social contact should be kept to a minimum in order that our learners remain safe and well.

Similarly Primary Schools are finding it increasingly difficult to maintain staffing levels as more staff and their families are identified as contacts or experience symptoms and have to organise tests. Schools have limited staffing options due of the need to separate contact groups to prevent the spread of the virus. We are concerned that this situation will worsen in the coming week.

**We have taken the decision that primary schools should also move to a distance learning approach from Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> December. This means that the last day on school sites for primary learners will be Monday 14<sup>th</sup> of December.**

However, schools will be able to offer childcare to the children of critical workers until Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> December, and for those in the very greatest need up to Friday 18<sup>th</sup> December. Households are now able to extend to one other household, which makes grandparents and other family members an option that should be explored to the full.

Parents requiring support with childcare should contact their child's school. In addition, as we have done throughout the pandemic, we will continue to provide support for our vulnerable learners and schools will make appropriate contact with families during the last week of this term in order to facilitate this. If your child is eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), you will receive a BACS payment.

On the 17<sup>th</sup> of December all schools will be reviewing their risk assessments and ensuring that any changes necessary are made prior to schools returning in January. This will include reviewing contact groups, arrangements for staggered starts and ensuring that our schools continue to be safe environments for our learners. Schools will inform you of any revised arrangements in due course.

On the 18<sup>th</sup> of December, schools will be planning for the start of the Spring Term 2021. This means that staff will be planning for a range of scenarios which could include face to face teaching and preparing for a range of distance learning options.

Schools will continue to support the Test Trace & Protect system until the 18<sup>th</sup> of December after which time if your child has been in a setting and has developed symptoms you should email [Education.coronavirus@pembrokeshire.gov.uk](mailto:Education.coronavirus@pembrokeshire.gov.uk).

If your child, or any member of your household has Covid-19 symptoms during the holiday period please continue to request a test by phoning 119 or using the online portal <https://gov.wales/apply-coronavirus-covid-19-test>.

If your child has a positive Covid test result over the holiday period please e mail your child's name, year group and school to [education.coronavirus@pembrokeshire.gov.uk](mailto:education.coronavirus@pembrokeshire.gov.uk) **Please note that the self-isolation period is now 10 days.**

Pupils in our schools have been extremely responsible in their response to the challenges faced during this term, and we are very proud of them. I would like to thank you as parents/carers for your co-operation and all our staff for their dedication this term.
