

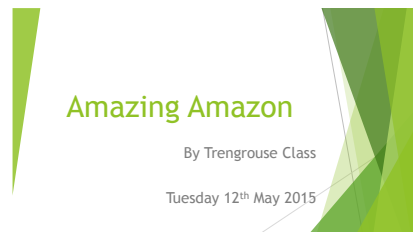
Trengrouse Newsletter, Friday 15th May 2015
