Maths:

Choose 3 times tables groups (i.e.)
x4, x5 and x8.

Practise the facts in each one, including the related division facts...

Can you come up with or spot any patterns? List these in your book as well.

x5

$$1 \times 5 = 5 \quad 5 \div 1 = 5 \quad 5 \div 5 = 1$$

$$2 \times 5 = 10 \quad 10 \div 2 = 5 \quad 10 \div 5 = 2$$

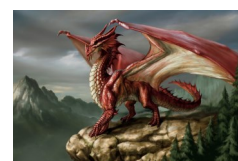
Patterns

All answers in the x5 table end in a 5 or 0.

Drawing arrays may help you spot patterns.

English/topic:

Put your dragon from the half term home learning into a short story - it could be written as a legend, like Saint George and the Dragon, which we have studied in class this week.



Spellings - 'o sounds' words

Boat, soap, coated, moat, hope, coped, elope, broke, soaked

Challenge; - fronted adverbials (adverbs) - great for myth and legend writing!

Slowly, unwittingly, cautiously, carefully, unintentionally, desperately, despairingly, bravely, heroically.

Choose 5 spellings from either list and put them into sentences!
