We then take great care in the analysis of this information and use it to make improvements wherever we can. This information is extremely valuable to us and helps us to make Perranporth an even better place to be! Thank you to all those who returned their questionnaires last term and for the very helpful suggestions for development - we will try to address many of those points through the course of the year and beyond.

Here are the headline results:
