Important Changes to Attendance

As parents will already be aware, at Perranporth School we believe that every single school day matters. For our children to gain the greatest benefit from their education it is vital that they attend regularly and your child should be at school, on time, every day the school is open unless the reason for the absence is completely unavoidable. In order to ensure that we maintain the highest standards of attendance and punctuality at Perranporth, from September 2018 our school will be working with a new Educational Welfare Service. This service comes through Cornwall Council and will be following a more rigorous approach to absence and in particular unauthorised absence.

Parents and carers should be aware that this will mean that attendance will be closely monitored by the EWS, especially unauthorised absence, holidays in term time and excessive days for illness. This type of absence can lead to the Local Authority using sanctions and/or legal proceedings with penalty notices being issued.

Unauthorised absences are those which the school does not consider reasonable and for which no "leave" has been given. This includes:

- ◆ Parents/carers keeping children off school unnecessarily
- ◆ All holidays in term time
- ◆ Truancy before or during the school day
- ◆ Absences which have never been properly explained
- ◆ All day dental/medical appointments (unless previously agreed)
- ◆ Shopping - even for school clothes or shoes
- ◆ Day away from school for birthdays
- ◆ Going with a brother or sister to their appointment or staying away if they are ill
- ◆ Looking after sick relatives or younger children (talk to us if this is an issue)
