

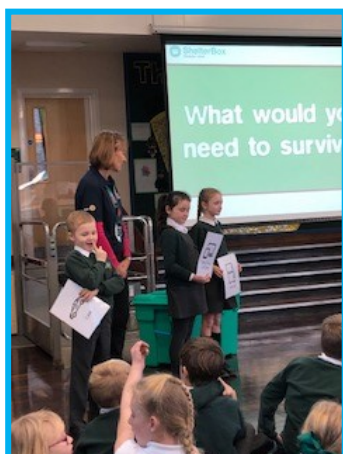
### School Litter Pick
