EDUCATION

At Clyro, we follow Values Education, which seeks to develop the whole child by teaching, guiding and aiding them to understand and reflect on values that are important to us, how they affect ourselves and those around us. Co-operation

Topics for the term - At Clyro, we teach cross-curricularly, allowing the children to see links in their learning. We aim to involve the children as much as possible in contributing ideas and suggestions as to what they would like to learn. This gives the children a sense of ownership and responsibility for their own learning. Here are our class topics:
Class 1 & 2 - "Remember, remember!";
Class 3 & 4 - "Who am I?" (Welsh and personal heritage)

GOVERNOR NEWS – CHAIR OF GOVERNORS

Hello and I hope everyone has settled into the new academic year at Clyro School. Thank you to everyone that has helped to make drop off and pick up run smoothly and calmly in these strange times. As well as all the pressures that the pupils, school staff and parents have dealt with as a result of Covid-19, we also have the usual financial stresses of running a rural school in times of budget cuts and uncertainty. As you may know, due to a revised funding formula we receive money for every group of 30 pupils, rather than per head. As we dropped below the magic figure of 91 pupils we have received £57,000 less money than if we had 92 or more pupils. (although on the date of counting we were 89 pupils) This means that our budget is incredibly tight and as governors we are doing all that we can to ensure that we continue to provide the best for the children of Clyro school. We have been meeting with Powys to discuss our finances and to work out the minimal impact on our children and our staff. We all know that birthrates fluctuate and year groups vary in size - the current Year 6 is a tiny year with only 6 pupils - my daughter being one of them. Other years have up to 20 and the figures look good with projections of 94+ pupils for future years. So what I would like to ask is if anyone has any brilliant fundraising ideas that are Covid-safe, then please do let us know, either through the Friends or through school or governors.

Battery Recycling and Ink Cartridges - We collect old batteries as we are taking part in a Powys battery recycling competition where we could win up to £500 worth of Amazon vouchers. The aim is to help the county meet recycling targets, cut landfill and carbon emissions, support Eco-schools work and inspire the next generation to recycle more. The collection box is in the school entrance. We also collect ink cartridges. If you have any, please put them in a bag and give them to a member of staff when you drop off your child. Thank you.
