

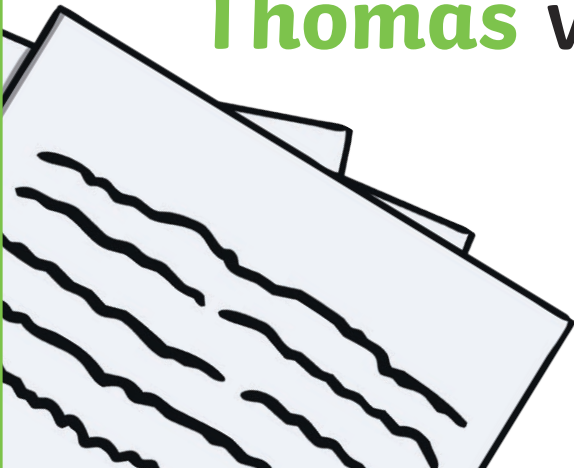
# Pronoun
